#### **Check-In Assessment**

#### **ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL - Reminder**

#### Attendance Policy – Application for extended leave.

The DoE Attendance policy requires parents who wish to take holidays during the school term to complete and Application for Extended Leave. The Camden Haven Community of Schools set the requirement for an application to be completed by parents if the intended absence is to be **greater than 5 school days.** 

*Family Holiday* – Parents planning a family holiday during a school term **must** 

- 1. Notify the Principal of the intended absence
- 2. Complete an Application for Extended Leave (if greater than 5 days) prior to the event.
- 3. If accepted, Principal will issue a Certificate of Extended Leave authorising approved absence from school.

**Reminder** All school age children are expected to attend school every day and if absent (illness or other) an explanation is required within 7 days (see Awesome App News).

#### Awesome App News

An absentee note is available on the App. Go to FORMS, open absentee note, fill in the fields and SEND. Your note explaining your child's absence will arrive on our school office e-mail, be printed and the absence recorded as 'justified'. I tested the process, very easy, and it worked.

#### SMS

An SMS message is also sent daily to your phone and you simply need to reply with the reason.
