#### **ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL - Reminder**

Attendance Policy – Application for extended leave. The DoE Attendance policy requires parents who wish to take holidays during the school term to complete an Application for Extended Leave. The Camden Haven Community of Schools set the requirement for an application to be completed by parents if the intended absence is to be greater than 5 school days.

*Family Holiday* – Parents planning a family holiday during a school term **must** 

- 1. Notify the Principal of the intended absence
- 2. Complete an Application for Extended Leave (if greater than 5 days) prior to the event.
- 3. If accepted, Principal will issue a Certificate of Extended Leave authorising approved absence from school.

**Reminder** All school age children are expected to attend school every day and if absent (illness or other) an explanation is required within 7 days.
